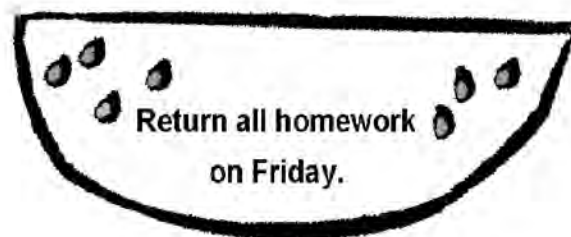


# June Homework Week 2

1. **BOOM Math Game** Use the instruction sheet to play boom. This is a great way to help your child to remember the numbers throughout the summer. Another variation is to ask your child to tell the number before or after the number that is drawn.
2. **My Color Word Book** This little book is used to help students practice reading the color words. Assist your child in coloring each picture correctly. Cut apart each page on the solid lines and staple into a small booklet. Practice reading this book throughout the summer to reinforce color words. Ask your child to point to each word as he/she reads each page to practice tracking in reading.
3. **My Kindergarten Memories** Please discuss and assist your child in completing each of the sentences. Ask your child to illustrate each page. Cut apart the pages in the book and staple the booklet together. This should be a nice keepsake for your child's year in Kindergarten!
4. **Measuring Objects** Follow the directions given to measure things around your house. This is a great way to teach measuring, perception, and estimation.
5. **Alphabet Writing** Encourage your child to use his/her best writing to complete the alphabet following the example in the first box. You might like to make a copy of this paper to practice throughout the summer.

## Boom Math Game

Cut apart all of the numbers and Boom cards on this page. Put all of the numbers and about 5-6 Boom cards in a paper bag. Or, you may choose to use all of the Boom cards. You can save the extra Boom cards to replace any lost cards. Store all of the cards in the paper bag for playing another time!

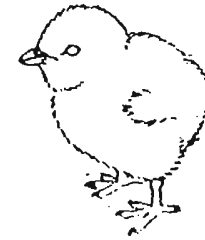
### Rules:

Taking turns, each player draws a "card" from the paper bag. If the student can identify the number, he/she gets to keep the card. If he/she cannot identify the number the next player tries. The game continues with each player. When a player receives a "Boom" card, he/she loses the cards and returns the cards to the bag! Even though the player loses his/her cards, he or she can continue playing---the player has to start collecting cards again. The player who has the most cards in their hand at the end of the game is the winner! The game continues around and around. You can put a time limit on the game using a timer.

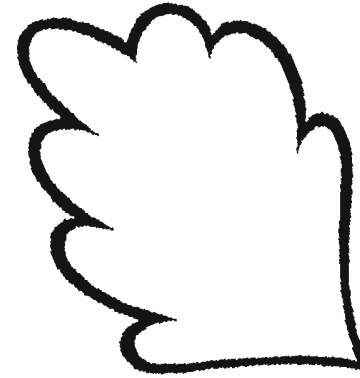
